#### **GO-Science Futures Toolkit**

Our work on refreshing the Government Office for Science's Futures Toolkit is entering its final stages. We have comprehensively reviewed each of 12 futures tools and techniques, as well as "pathways" (ways in which tools can be combined to achieve an outcome), and have now agreed the final text with the client. We've also looked at issues like facilitating futures workshops, the futures and policy cycle, and other ways to develop scenarios. Many of the tools are accompanied by comprehensive worksheets for the first time. The next phase is working with our design partners Davydov to produce a totally new design that is much easier to use and navigate.

The new Toolkit is planned to be up and running and accessible to the public on Gov.uk in the Autumn.

### **Futures Issues**

Large language models sometimes have "dark personality patterns".

Designers are taking inspiration from <u>dragon-fly wings</u> to design Boeing 777 wings that are lighter, more efficient using fewer materials, leading to considerable savings in fuel and costs.

A <u>back support exoskeleton</u> has been developed at the Istituto Italiano di Tecnologia (Italian Institute of Technology—IIT) to improve railway workers' safety and conditions for heavy manual material handling during maintenance and renewal operations.

A mobile, robotic-controlled uncrewed ground vehicle can <u>provide remote</u> <u>assessment and treatment of casualties</u> in high-risk environments such as humanitarian disasters.

The EU is moving to treat <u>new genomic techniques</u> differently from GMOs. Two newly released JRC reports describe case studies of how crops developed through gene editing could become celiac-safe (using mutagenesis) or resistant to disease to allow reduced use of pesticides (cisgenesis).
